Important administrative matters and compliance

As the <u>Membership and Financial Report</u> provides detailed accounts of these important topics, here are only **some key pointers**:

- The financial report for July 2024–June 2025 shows that ICLHE ended the year with a small deficit, following two previous years with positive balances. Membership income has stabilized but still does not cover annual running costs, while website expenses have risen, and no revenue was generated from events due to the postponement of the planned conference.
- The deficit was **smaller than expected** because some planned costs were delayed, reduced, or not used. In the medium term, ICLHE may need to **consider introducing a fee for event registrations or raising membership fees**, which have not been increased since its establishment.

Note (in support of Calls for Action):

While our finances are limited, our budget includes **some financial support for ICLHE activities**. More specifically, there are **small running cost grants for each RG and SIG**, which may help towards maintaining the group, organizing meetings or contributing to honoraria to invited speakers.

The <u>ICLHE website</u> continues to serve as a dynamic hub for our community, requiring ongoing care and collective input to keep it vibrant and relevant. Its success relies not only on the dedication of the Board, but also on the active participation of all members. We encourage everyone to contribute - whether by sharing resources, updates, or insights - to help ensure the platform remains a valuable and evolving space for networking, inspiration, and professional growth. 


ICLHE website enhancements in 2025

Throughout 2025, the ICLHE website has undergone a series of updates, which we hope will make our digital presence even more informative, engaging and easy to use:

To support our members, we introduced a **new automated** reminder system for membership renewals. This system now sends a series of helpful prompts, beginning 30 days before expiry, followed by a grace period email, and additional reminders at one and two weeks into the grace period. These communications are seamlessly integrated with the Treasurer's member lists, ensuring coherence and accuracy across our records and the website. Alongside this, we have implemented a streamlined invoice template to simplify renewals.

- Our technical capabilities have also expanded. We now offer **enhanced email communications**, allowing us to reach up to 500 members per month, and have set up automations to make these processes more efficient. For new and returning members, we've created **step-by-step video guides** on how to post and log in to the member zone, which are now featured in our newsletters.
- Content and community engagement remain at the heart of ICLHE. We added our new Content Educator Special Interest Group (CESIG) to the SIG/RG pages, complete with a discussion forum to foster collaboration and idea-sharing. Our resources page has seen updates as well such as the 2023 Vienna and 2024 Wiesbaden symposia readily accessible to our members. The webinar process has been improved through our Wix platform, making it easier for members to participate and stay informed. We have also updated the board minutes page, giving it a cleaner and more user-friendly layout.



ICLHE ACTIVITIES


ICLHE offers various platforms to share information and activities & events to get engaged:

- Our **newsletter** is **published quarterly**, offering concise updates alongside spotlight interviews that showcase the vibrant voices within our community. - As part of our **ongoing webinar series**, each session lasting 60 to 90 minutes, we explore current and emerging topics relevant to our community. With the consent of our speakers—and subject to technical reliability—webinars are **recorded** and **made available to members** who are unable to attend live. 

● The format of <u>SIGs & RGs</u> allows for **smaller networks to develop**. Presently, there are the RGs (Regional Groups) for Spain, Italy, East Asia and DACH (German speaking regions), and two Special Interest Groups (SIGs). The PhD SIG and, most recently the Content Educators SIG.



- Once a year, there is a larger ICLHE event, either a symposium or a conference, which also features our AGM.
 - The **2024 symposium** titled "Bridging the gap: The ideal and the reality of teaching content through L2 in higher education" took place on 10-11 October 2024 at the **Hochschule Rhein/Main in Wiesbaden** and brought together researchers and practitioners from 15 countries. In a sequence of different formats presentations by established and early career researchers, workshops and bring & share sessions, and a roundtable discussion the participants shared their research and practice work, explored innovative approaches, and identified challenges and opportunities for ICLHE (for more details the Newsletter Issue 4, Fall 2024). 
